

Details of Information:

At 0045hrs. this date a call came in from No B operator. Male caller identified himself as Louis GATSCH to the best of my knowledge as the voice seemed muffled. Caller stated address was 2231 Community Plaza and they needed an officer there. I asked the reason and he said they were having some sort of commotion there. He would not give the nature. I asked for the phone number and was given 341-4670. At this time he hung up the phone. I tried the number 341-4670 and no one answered. This phone was not available in the cris cross or city directory. Further checking with NWB Information verified it was a working number but not available as to listing. Another attempt to call was made through the NWB "O" with instructions to hold the line. No one answered. Call attempt repeated at 0515hrs. with same results. In my opinion the callers voice was very similar to the male caller that gave the call to 2867 Ohio on 17 Aug 70. At that time he gave his address as 2865 Ohio. No car was sent to 2231 Community Plaza as the call could not be verified to my satisfaction per standard Operating Procedure.

At about 2310 Hrs. 22 Aug ,1970 . Received a call to go to 2816 Parker str . and meet Lt. Perry . Upon arrival we were requested to take photographic evidence of the interior of the residence at 2816 Parker .

Eighteen black and white photographs were taken at this residence 18 photo's in the inside ,and one was taken showing the front of the residence .

Sixteen photographs taken in color ,were taken at this residence , 15 photo's were taken of the interior , one was taken showing the front of the residence .

Officers at the scene confiscated 14 sticks of Dynamite from the inside this residence (2816 Parker str) . This was brought to Central Station ,were John Powers Criminalistics tech. dusted this dynamite for latent prints . Two photo's were taken showing the dynamite . There no legible latent prints lifted from this dynamite .

The Negatives to the above photo's were turned over to the Photo lab for processing .

The dynamite was left with a Alcohol ,Tabacco Tax Unit investigator , Daley.

DETAILS of Investigation: (Arrests, — Rec. Prop. — Additional Evidence, etc.)

At 2000, 22 Aug 70 ~~at 2000~~ Lt. Perry, Sgts. Jack Swanson, Jerry Volcek, Robert Pfeffer, and Officer Tony Mohatt, tried to apprehend PEAK, Duane Christopher, Negro/male, 16 yrs. of age, in regards to the bombing death of Officer MINARD. We checked the North 24th Street area with negative results and also went to 3528 North 29th Street, the home of PEAK, Frank Sr. and was notified that he was not at this address by Sgt. Pitman Foxall. Sgt. Foxall stated that he had checked the house and he was positive that the PEAKS were not at this address.

At 2230, armed with a search warrant issued by Judge Simon A. Simon after having reason to believe that David RICE, Militant to the City of Omaha, may possibly be connected with the bombing death of Officer MINARD, and could possibly have explosives stored at his home, we checked the RICE residence at 2916 Parker St. and in so doing found in the basement hidden under a wooden door, a case of dynamite, two and one half inches (2 1/2") in diameter. We also found explosive caps, and wires hidden behind the radio in the front room of the RICE residence, also three rifles and a pistol were confiscated and sizable amount of ammunition was also found at this address.

Refer to supplementary reports by Sgt. Swanson, and also Property Report by Officers Steimer and Howard as to the evidence recovered at the RICE home.

At 0004 23 Aug 70, after advising the following person of his Constitutional Rights as stated in the Marinda Decision and the Rights Advisory Form being completed, and after being so advised of his rights, I questioned the following person of his activities near the RICE home at the time that it was searched by the reporting officers.

WOODS, Ethan (IMM) 20, Neg/male, (DOB) 7 Jan 50, 2040 North 30th Ave, married one child, employed by the City of Omaha as a tree trimmer. WOODS stated that he and Michael RICE, a brother of David RICE, were going to visit David RICE'S home at 2916 Parker Street, and when they got there found the front door open and the television set on. He stated that about a week ago RICE'S house had been burglarized and they thought perhaps it had been burglarized again this evening. He said he and Michael RICE hollered in the front door to see if DAVID was home and when they received no response they checked the side door on

the East side, hollered in there for DAVID and upon receiving no response Michael RICE went out to the street, and he, WOODS, stood in the back to see if anyone would run from the house as they believed that someone was still in there. He stated that he was checking the back yard when he was arrested by the Police.

WOODS states that he has no knowledge of the bombing death of Officer MINARD, or any other bombings occurring in the City of Omaha recently, except what he had read in the paper. Also states that he has or had no knowledge that RICE had dynamite stored in his basement as he had only been to RICE'S house on one other occassion. WOODS offered to take a lie detector examination to substantiate his story.

At 0012, 23 Aug 70, I then talked to the following person in the CIB office, 4th Floor, Central Police Headquarters, and after advising him of his Constitutional Rights as stated in the Marinda Decesion he completed the Rights Advisory Form, and after being advised of his rights, he offered the following information:

RICE, Michael Irwin, Neg/male, 18, (DOB) 14 Sept 51, 2906 Franklin Street, 342-5213, employed for Northwestern Bell Telephone Company as an installer, single. RICE stated that he and WOODS were visiting a friend, JOHNSON, Ted, at approximately 2000 at 29th and Decatur Streets, when Ted JOHNSON'S mother told him and them that someone was fooling around with his brother DAVID'S house at 2916 Parker Street. He stated that he and WOODS walked over to DAVID'S house and saw the side door was open and could hear the television inside, playing. He said he checked the house by hollering inside for DAVID and when he didn't hear anything believed that someone was or had been inside. He stated that recently David RICE'S house had been burglarized and they believed that it had been burglarized again this evening. He stated that he and WOODS were checking the yard when the Police apprehended them and brought them to Central Station. I questioned him whether he had any knowledge regarding the recent bombings in the City of Omaha and also the bombing death of Officer MINARD on 17 August 70, and he also stated that he does not know his brother's activities and that he did not know anything about the bombing except what he had read in the paper. He also stated that he had no knowledge that his brother, DAVID

At the request of Lt. James Perry, Annie Lee NORRIS was examined on the polygraph . The purpose of the examination was an attempt to determine if she was withholding any information relative to the above captioned Homicide and investigation. Only one test was run at the time and the only information subject was able to add was a conversation between Duane and Donnie PEAK on Monday night following the explosion, in which one of them stated that "the DUDE that made the explosion had to be smart, and that the Police had said that it would take ten days, and after they were able to determine the explosive they would probably trace it to where it come from, but they would never find out who got it". The only other thing that she could add was the fact that Duane PEAK has been dating a girl by the name of JEAN, who visits next door to ANNIE'S home at the residence of Charmaine WHITE.
