

In 1995, Norma stated in an interview that she did not give Duane a ride to Mondo's house on August 16. She would have remembered it because she had to borrow her father's black Ford if someone asked her for a ride. She remembered giving Duane a ride to Mondo's house sometime that summer, well before the bombing. She believed the prosecution was fabricating Duane's testimony and weaving bits and pieces of truth into it. She fled Omaha in fear for her life. Norma did not come back to live in Omaha for 11 years, but she was forever changed because of the trauma of the ensuing years. After she hired an attorney and filed a petition in 2000, the court removed from her record the 30-year-old conspiracy and accessory charges that were never formally filed against her.
